As per the Karnataka State Govt. Notification ED 43 TEC 2011 dated 21-3-2011 the academic eligibility for admission to B.E./ B.Tech. courses has been amended from the academic year 2011-2012 and is as follows.

Existing :As per Govt. order ED 10 TEC 2006 dt: 28-2-2006	Amended & to be followed from 2011-2012 As per Govt. order ED 43 TEC 2011 Dt: 21-3-2011
The candidate shall have passed the second year Pre University or XII standard or equivalent examinations held preceding the entrance test with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects , along with one of the following subjects:- Chemistry, Bio-Technology, <u>Computer Science</u>, Biology, <u>Electronics</u> and has secured not less than forty five(45%) percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects with English as one of the language for admission to Engineering & Technology Courses.	The candidate shall have passed the second year Pre University or XII standard or equivalent examinations held preceding the entrance test with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects , along with one of the following subjects:- Chemistry, Bio-Technology, Biology, and has secured not less than fifty percent(50%) of the aggregate marks in optional subjects with English as one of the language for admission to Engineering & Technology Courses.
Provided further that the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty percent (40%) of aggregate in optional subjects in case of candidates belonging to the **Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Engineering and Technology courses.	Provided further that the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty five percent (45%) of aggregate in optional subjects in case of candidates belonging to the ** Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Engineering and Technology courses.

Please Note: **** the relaxation in academic eligibility is extended only to Karnataka candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Classes**

You are hereby informed to note the amendment in the subjects and minimum percentage to be obtained by the candidates seeking admission to B.E./B.Tech. courses from the academic year 2011-12.

The above amendment shall also be applicable to the candidates seeking admission under management quota.

Hence, you are hereby informed to note the same and take due care while admitting candidates to the respective courses.

Any violation of the above rule shall not be approved by the University.

The contents of this Notification shall be brought to the notice of all the concerned.

3. Academic Eligibility - (1) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to any of the full time degree courses specified in sub-rule (3) of Rule 1 other than the degree course in Architecture, unless he,-

(a) has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Common Entrance Test Cell,

(b) has passed the second year Pre-University or XII standard or equivalent examinations held preceding the Entrance test,-

(i) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages and has secured not less than fifty percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects and has secured not less than fifty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Entrance Test, for admission to Medical and Dental courses.

(ii) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages and has secured not less than fifty percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects for admission to Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy.

(iii) with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects, along with one of the following subjects: - Chemistry, Bio-Technology, Computer Science, Biology, Electronics and has secured not less than forty five percent of the aggregate marks in optional subjects with English as one of the languages for admission to Engineering and Technology courses.

Provided that the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty percent of the aggregate in optional subjects and forty percent of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in Entrance Test in case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government Order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Medical and Dental courses.

Provided further that, the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility shall be forty percent of aggregate in optional subjects in case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes specified in the relevant Government Order for the purpose of reservation in respect of Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy, Engineering and Technology courses.

(c) has completed 17 years of age as on 31st December of the year of admission, for admission to Medical, Dental, Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses.

Provided that no candidate who has obtained a seat in any discipline through the CET Cell in any previous year shall be eligible to appear for the Common Entrance Test conducted by the CET Cell for selection of a seat in the same discipline.

(2) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to full time degree course in Architecture unless,-

(a) he has appeared for the aptitude Test Part-I and II conducted by CET Cell; and

(b) has passed the Pre-University examination or equivalent examination held preceding the entrance test with Mathematics and English as subjects and has secured fifty percent of the aggregate marks in all subjects and has appeared for an Aptitude Test conducted by the CET Cell and has secured not less than forty percent of marks taken together in both part-I & II of the Aptitude test, for admission to Architecture course.

(3) A candidate shall be eligible for admission to any of the full-time degree courses specified in clause (C) of sub rule (3) of rule 1, if he has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted under rule 17 and is the holder of a diploma in the appropriate branch of engineering specified in SCHEDULE-I, awarded by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka or equivalent qualification and has secured not less than forty percent of marks in the final year examination in the fifth and sixth semesters in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes and has secured not less than forty five percent of marks in respect of others;

(4) No candidate shall be eligible for admission to part-time course in Second Year Third Semester of Bachelor's degree in Engineering and Technology, unless he:-

(a) has appeared for the Common Entrance Test conducted under rule 17;

(b) is a holder of a 'Diploma' in appropriate branch of Engineering specified in Schedule-I granted by the Board of Technical Examination in Karnataka and has secured not less than forty percent of marks in the final year examination in the fifth and sixth semesters in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes and has secured not less than forty five percent of marks in respect of others; and

(c) has on the first September of the year of admission not less than one-year's professional experience in the branch of Engineering/Technology, in which the candidate holds a diploma, after passing diploma course.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Karnataka Education Institutions (Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1984 (Karnataka Act 37 of 1984), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006 namely:-

1. Title and Commencement.- (1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government seats in Professional Educational Institutions (Second Amendment) Rules, 2011.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2. Amendment of rule 3.- In the Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules) in rule 3,-

(1) in sub-rule (1), in clause (b), in sub-clause (iii),-

- (i) the words "computer science" and the word "electronics" shall be omitted.
- (ii) for the words "forty five percent" the words "fifty percent" shall be substituted.
- (iii) in the second proviso, for the words "forty percent", the words "forty five percent" shall be substituted.


(2) in sub-rule (3), for the words "forty percent" and the words "forty-five percent" the words " forty five percent" and the words "fifty percent" shall respectively be substituted.

3. Amendment of rule 5.- In rule 5 of the said rules, in sub-rule (1),

- (i) in clause (v), for the words and figures "one year from 1st July of the previous year to 30th June of the year of admission"; the words and figures "one year service in Karnataka during the two year period of Pre-University or 11th or 12th Standard course" shall be substituted;
- (ii) in clause (vi), after the words "Defence Unit", the words "of Army / Air force / Navy where the parent's service records are maintained" shall be inserted.
- (iii) in clause (ix), for the words and figures "one year in Karnataka from 1st July of the previous year to 30th June of the year of admission", the words and figures "one year service in Karnataka during the two year period of Pre-University or 11th or 12th Standard course" shall be substituted.

4. Amendment of rule 17.- In rule 17 of the said rules, in sub-rule (1), for the words "Ten percent", the words "Twenty percent" shall be substituted.

ADMISSION TO PROFESSIONAL COURSES IN KARNATAKA FOR THE YEAR 2011-12

- Applicants are invited from eligible candidates of Karnataka including the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants for registration for the "Common Entrance Test-2011" for admissions to First Year Medical / Dental / Ayurveda / Homeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga / Engineering / Technology / Architecture courses for the seats to be notified by the Government in the Professional Educational Institutions in the state of Karnataka for the academic year 2011-12.
- A candidate must appear for the Common Entrance Test conducted by the Karnataka Examinations Authority, for PCB subjects in case of admission to Medical / Dental / Ayurveda / Homeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga courses and PCM subjects in case of admission to Engineering / Technology courses. For admission to Architecture course the candidate must appear for NATA (National Aptitude Test in Architecture) conducted by the Council of Architecture and they must compulsorily obtain CET-2011 brochure and submit the filled application form. (Visit KEA website for list of institutions conducting NATA)
- The merit will be determined in accordance with the provisions of the "Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government Seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006".
- Academic Eligibility :
 - For Medical / Dental courses, the applicant should have passed Karnataka 2nd PUC / 12th std. or equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and with English as one of the languages of study and have **obtained a minimum of 50% of marks in aggregate in the PCB group and should secure a minimum of 50% of marks in aggregate in PCB subjects in the Common Entrance Test.** In case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes (Category-1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B), the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility will be 40% of marks in aggregate in PCB group both in Qualifying Examination and Common Entrance Test.
 - For Ayurveda / Homeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga courses, the applicant should have passed Karnataka 2nd PUC / 12th std. or equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and with English as one of the languages of study and have **obtained a minimum of 50% of marks in aggregate in PCB group irrespective of marks obtained in the Common Entrance Test.** In case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes (Category-1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B), the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility will be 40% of marks in aggregate in PCB group in the qualifying examination. For admission to Medical / Dental / Ayurveda / Homeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga courses, the candidate should have completed the age of 17 years as on 31st of December 2011.
 - For Engineering / Technology courses, the applicant should have passed Karnataka 2nd PUC / 12th Std. or equivalent examination with Physics and Mathematics along with Chemistry / Bio-Technology / Biology as optional subjects with English as one of the languages of study and **obtained a minimum of 50% of marks in aggregate in the optional subjects,** irrespective of marks obtained in the Common Entrance Test. In case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes (Category-1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B), the minimum marks for the purpose of eligibility will be 45% of marks in aggregate in the optional subjects in the qualifying examination.
 - For Architecture course, the applicant should have passed Karnataka 2nd PUC / 12th Std. or equivalent examination with Mathematics as a compulsory optional subject and **obtained a minimum of 50% of marks in aggregate in all the subjects in the qualifying examination** (45% of marks in case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes) and should compulsorily appear for NATA (National Aptitude Test in Architecture) and get a minimum of 40% in it. (Including Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes)

IMPORTANT NOTE :

- A candidate who had obtained a seat in any discipline through the KEA (CET Cell) in any of the previous years will not be eligible to appear for the Common Entrance Test-2011 for selection of a seat in the same discipline. Such candidate will immediately forfeit the seat selected by him during the previous years, upon selection of a seat in a different discipline during the year.
- The merit list of candidates for admission to Medical and Dental courses will be determined only on the basis of marks obtained by candidates in PCB subjects, taken together, in the Common Entrance Test. For Ayurveda / Homeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga / Engineering / Technology courses, the merit list will be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the respective optional subjects, in both qualifying examination and the Common Entrance Test taken in equal proportions. For Architecture course, the merit list will be determined on the basis of marks obtained in both qualifying examination and NATA taken in equal proportions.

5. SUPPLY OF BROCHURE CUM APPLICATION FORM :

Brochure cum application form will be supplied through the schools / colleges located within the State of Karnataka in which the students are studying 2nd PUC or 12th standard examination upon submission of Demand Draft for Rs. 650/- to the Principals in advance, drawn in favour of "The Executive Director, Karnataka Examinations Authority, Bangalore", payable at Bangalore and Rs. 500/- for students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Category-1. The repeater and ex-students who have passed the qualifying examination within the State of Karnataka before 2010 should also submit the Demand Draft for the above said amount to the respective schools / colleges. The Last date for submission of Demand Draft, to the Principal of Schools and Colleges within Karnataka will be 11-03-2011.

The Karnataka candidates residing outside Karnataka (Horanadu, Gadimadu and other Karnataka candidates i.e. who fulfills the eligibility conditions) who are studying or who have studied 12th standard or equivalent examination outside the State of Karnataka, within the territory of India, can procure the brochure cum application form by "SPEED POST", by sending a self-addressed cloth-lined envelope of size 25 cm x 30 cm along with a Demand Draft for Rs. 750/- drawn in favour of "The Executive Director, Karnataka Examinations Authority, Bangalore", payable at Bangalore and a Karnataka candidate residing outside India can get the brochure cum application form by sending a Demand Draft for Rs. 5,000/-. The contents of the self-addressed envelope should be in English or Kannada language only. The cover in which the Demand Draft and self-addressed envelope are sent should be boldly super scribed with the words "REQUEST FOR CET-2011 BROCHURE" and should be sent to the following address of Executive Director by "Speed Post" ONLY. The KEA will not take responsibility for the envelopes sent through courier or given in person or through any other private arrangement and also for incomplete and insufficient address on the envelope. The last date for submission of Demand Drafts by "Speed Post" will be 15-03-2011.

The Brochure will be supplied to the schools & colleges in Karnataka & also to the students who are residing outside the State of Karnataka on or after 21-03-2011.
